Email Exchange On 04/15/11

"Please let me know more about your product. I am interested in trying it out."

Email Exchange 4-28-11

"...I am postponing ordering my liquid fertilizer for the time being, but time is of the essence. This product is approved for use on Certified Organic farms, correct???"

Email Exchange 4-29-11

"We are an old fashioned truck farm. We grow anything and everything that will grow in Western North Carolina. We also have 6000 sq ft of heated greenhouses that produce mesclun, baby spinach, salad mix etc in winter. I'll take the 2 gallons."

Email Exchange 5/06/2011

"Our order arrived today. I'll be testing it on side by side rows of the same crops in the same ground planted at the same time. Soy Beans, Onions, tomatoes and potatoes."

Email Exchange 8-16-11

"I am sufficiently impressed with that product you shipped me that I am interested in applying as a standard practice on our farm. I did not do any 'study' type studies, but used it in a zone or two of our irrigation system and noticed a healthy appearing more vigorous look to those zones."

LinkedIn Post 9-11-11:

"I used SumaGreen with SumaGrow inside last year. It gives good results and lowers the need for fertilizer. I couldn't afford organic fertilizer last year and that product got me through with NO problems. .."

September 13 LinkedIn post:

"I used this product... used my pesticide tank to inject it into the drip lines on several zones.
